BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE AMERICAN LEGION AUXILIARY NEW

MEXICO GIRLS STATE:

A. "Food Waste" - means any edible product place into the trash.

Permits - School cafeterias throughout the state of New Mexico must have a plan

concerning what to do or where to put food waste solutions may include:

1 A. Cafeterias may send their food to animals at local livestock farms to feed animals such  
2 as pigs, goats, chickens, etc. In addition, when using such solution you can charge  
3 livestock owners but no more than one dollar per pound. Buyers will be in charge of  
4 transportation of the commodity unless otherwise arranged.

5 B. Cafeterias may start a compost within school property. Compost can be turned into a  
6 school garden for elementary student. The science department can be turned into a school  
7 garden for elementary student. The science department can use the garden of it can be  
8 used as an extra curricular class. If compost is not used in a garden can be sold and/or  
9 given to local greenhouse as well as local community members with gardens.

10 C. Cafeterias can use the food waste for renewable energy. School boards can discuss  
11 ideas for using renewable energy and apply for grants from the state.
